

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

The field of teaching is one of our country's most important social service professions. When you have earned the Bachelor of Arts in Education degree from Wichita State University, you'll have gained the credentials for teaching kindergarten through sixth grade in Kansas schools, and with minor modifications, be eligible for licensure in other states. The degree provides a balance of general education, general professional education, specific knowledge related to elementary education, comprehensive training in methods of teaching and observation and internship with children.

Wichita State's College of Education has more than 60 faculty members who work closely with you, maintain cooperative relationships with area school districts and remain active in their professional and research activities. Several have received university teaching awards and some have been recognized as leaders in their fields by professional societies.

Wichita State University students are provided with a variety of urban, suburban, and rural schools where they observe, work through

cooperative education, and eventually student teach.
